"When the TransFan Feeding Hen is in the open position," Bulger continued, "it pivots on top of the stake when the wind blows, which gives the illusion of a turkey feeding. There is also a set-screw which can be tightened for minimum or maximum wind resistance. The TransFan Feeding and Resting Hens can be used alone, or with the TransFan Gobbler. They are to be used as visual aids when using calls, and calms hunting pressured turkeys."
